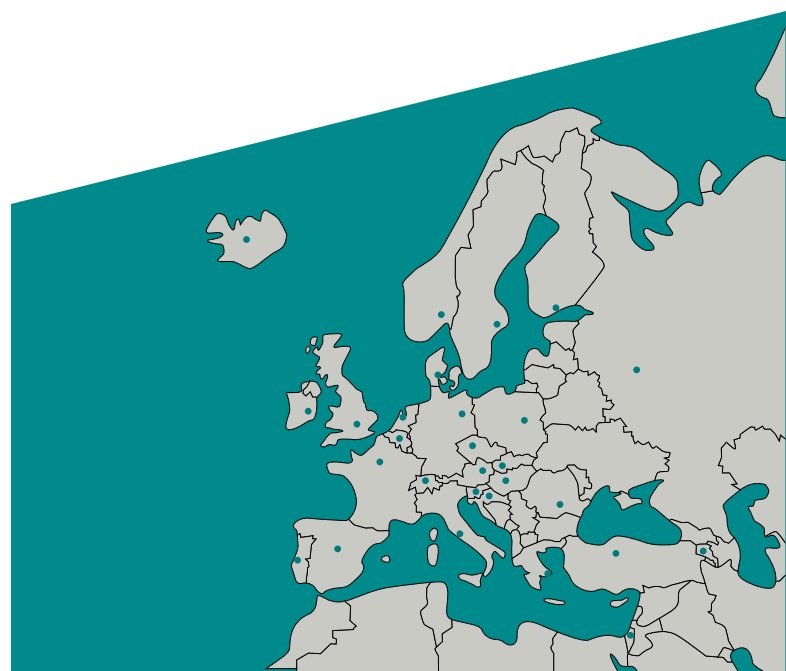

Dear colleagues,

Many of us had the privilege of attending the 17th European Microscopy Congress, EMC2024 (<https://emc2024.eu/>), held in Copenhagen from August 25-30, 2024. EMC2024 attracted approximately 2,500 participants from 51 countries worldwide, providing a platform for researchers at all career stages from both academia and industry to share their insights. In addition to a top-tier international and multidisciplinary conference, EMC2024 featured Europe's largest exhibition dedicated to microscopy. The congress also offered numerous training sessions and scientific activities, highlighting the vibrancy of European research. Due to a well-structured scientific program and an impressive exhibition area featuring numerous appealing company booths, the conference was highly appreciated by the delegates. We would like to sincerely thank the exhibitors for their dedication and support, and the attendees for their participation and valuable scientific contributions.



On August 26, 2024, the EMS Executive Board convened for the final time in its 2020-2024 term. During this meeting, many of the society's key activities and issues were discussed, evaluated, and concluded. On August 27, 2024, the EM award ceremony took place, where the two recipients were honoured and presented their work. Quentin RAMASSE (France) from the University of Leeds, UK, received the Physical/Materials Sciences and Optics award, while Tomáš ČIŽMÁR (Czech Republic) from Institute of Scientific Instruments of CAS, Brno, Czech Republic and from Friedrich-Schiller University Jena, Germany, was awarded the Life Sciences prize. At the EMS General Council on August 28, 2024, the proposal for the next venue of the European Microscopy Congress in 2028 was presented, with Barcelona and Brno as the final bidding destinations. The General Council selected Barcelona as the host city for EMC2028. We eagerly look forward to this event and hope to see you all there!



The EMS General Assembly was held on August 29, 2024, with over 180 EMS members in attendance. The presidential and financial reports were approved, the changes in the constitution were approved and Klaus Qvortrup gave a brief update on EMC 2024.
