EMS Yearbook:

Soon, you will receive the 2017 EMS Yearbook, containing the reports from our members and from several activities of our society throughout the past year. These will include descriptions written by early stage career researchers who received a scholarship to attend one of the two EMC extensions: Microscopy Conference 2017 (MC2017), August 21-25, 2017 in Lausanne, Switzerland or the 13th Multinational Congress on Microscopy (MCM2017), September 24-29, 2017 in Rovinj, Croatia. EMS Scholarships:

For the present year, EMS has received more than 90 applications for participation at the 19th International Microscopy Congress (IMC19), to be held from 9-14 September 2018, in Sydney. This year, 24 scholarships of 900 € each have been granted, which has also been possible due to a generous donation from the French Society of Microscopy (SF μ). This valuable support is intended to EMS young colleagues to present their results and learn from the specialists at international events.

EMS Outstanding Paper Awards:

Few weeks ago, the Executive Board of the European Microscopy Society (EMS) has received the decision of the Jury concerning the EMS Outstanding Paper Award for the year 2017. In total 15 high quality papers were nominated by EMS members, and the following three were selected as award winners:
